- Ability to earn additional industry recognized certifications



FGP Staff is focusing on a variety of

alternative volunteer assignments for the foster grandparents. One of the focus areas is the Aging Mastery Program. The program is designed to be a foundation to help older individuals focus on positive behaviors that will enable them to address the new realities of aging. The foster grandparents will be prompted to take small steps that will make their life better and motivate them to help others. This program will be a 10 -15-week program that will be a self-directed educational guide that will include zoom meetings and conference calls with program staff on a weekly basis. This program will be available to the volunteers in January 2021.

A few foster grandparents are serving at their regular volunteer station site or an alternative volunteer station site. All foster grandparents not serving are receiving a temporary stipend allowance through December 31, 2020.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT UPDATES

In November, Governor Justice announced the Transportation Alternative grants for the state. Our region received 5 awards. The Town of Elizabeth was awarded 100,000 dollars for a sidewalk improvement project. City of Parkersburg was awarded 100,000 dollars for St.Marys/Dudley streetscape improvements. Both the Town of Harrisville and City of Pennsboro were awarded 100,000 dollars for on going phases of sidewalk improvements. Finally, the City of Williamstown received a 100,000 dollars award for school sidewalk improvements.

Other Updates: The Sistersville's water project is now under construction. The Town of Ellenboro water project is now under construction as well. Grantsville water project will hold a bid-opening November 18th. The Calhoun County FEMA project has now moved to the appraisal stage.
