Community Development Updates

The Mid-Ohio Valley Regional Council will be joining U.S. Senator Joe Manchin and West Virginia State Auditor J.B. McCuskey for an informational session hosted by the West Virginia Regional Development Councils. This State Auditor Guidance Seminar for 2021 will be held at West Virginia University at Parkersburg on May 17th at 10:00 am to discuss funding information for the American Rescue Plan.

The MOVRC provided a press release to encourage the publication of this article, which is hoped to encourage new users for the Jackson County Commission's CDBG funded wireless broadband in Sandyville. The high-speed internet has been available since November 2020 and only 12 users have connected. The grant period is hoped to be extended to allow more time toward reaching the goal of 100 households.

There are multiple projects going out to bid this month, including: the Pennsboro Water System Improvements project bid opening is Wednesday, May 12th; the City of Spencer's Emergency Water project bid opening will take place on May 20th; and the Grantsville Water Treatment Plant Improvements project bid opening will be held on May 26th.

The Community Development Program has submitted intents to apply for transportation alternative grants and projects with the West Virginia Department of Transportation on behalf of several communities. These applications include the City of Spencer, Williamstown, the Town of Harrisville, the City of Ravenswood, and the City of Sistersville. The final applications will be completed before the deadline of June 7th.
