WWW Attends Training

WWW Staff attendend the Partnering for a Better Future Conference in Morgantown April 18-19, 2018. The conference was co-sponsored by the West Virginia Association of Metropolitan Planning Organizations and the West Virginia Local Technical Assistance Program. During the two-day conference attendees were presented with information relative to several topics ranging from emerging technology, asset management, safety planning, complete streets, and road bond implementation. The conference also provided opportunities for networking and sharing success stories throughout the state.

In the coming months WWW will complete the Work Program for Fiscal Year 2019 (beginning July 1, 2018). The Work Program focuses on planning emphasis areas identified by the Federal Highway Administration, State Departments of Transportation and the continuation of many planning efforts and studies initiated in previous fiscal years. In FY2019 WWW will focus on addressing the Performance Measures and Target which aims to make transportation investments more transparent, cost effective and performance based. Other activities will include the development of a new Transportation Improvement Program for Fiscal Years 2020-2023, as well as the development planning studies and data collection activities throughout the region.

For a number of years, WWW has been a partner and stakeholder in the development of bicycle and pedestrian related projects throughout the region. Muskingum Township in Washington County, Ohio which is studying potential corridors for the multi-use trail that will connect the communities of Devola and Marietta, Ohio, held a public meeting on Tuesday, April 10, 2018 at the Devola Volunteer Fire Company (1286 Masonic Park Road, Marietta, OH 45750) at 4:30 pm for the Devola Multi-Use Trail. The public was given an opportunity to learn more about the proposed project and provide input on potential corridor paths. The project was presented to the public and was followed by a question and answer session. Representatives of the consultant team (Woolpert) were available at posts near presentation boards depicting potential trail alignment to provide information, answer questions and discuss the Study.





The MOVRC Foster Grandparent Program and Retired and Senior Volunteer Program held an event at the Ravenswood Senior Center on Tuesday, April 3, 2018 to celebrate National Service Recognition Day.





Community Development Code Enforcement Update

MOVRC is close to an official notification of approval of our \$100,000 technical assistance grant, but a few months from ARC's decision on our code enforcement application to them. The good news from the Housing Fund, is that future applications for the technical assistance grant will now consider demolition as an eligible expense. This could be a great resource to allow our



communities to address some key dilapidated structures, as more than one town in our region could each apply for up to \$10,000. Please keep in touch with Luke on your bad building needs and consider organizing or updating a bad building registry for your community to prepare for the availability of demolition funds or code enforcement activity.
